The three colored prefixes (**red**, **blue**, **purple**) describe relationships. The **red** ones describe the relationship of someone to something. The **blue** ones describe the relationship of something to someone. The **purple** ones describe the relationship of someone to someone. They are at the core of understanding how Onöndowa'ga: Gawë:nö' works.
