Below is information regarding the admissions test process.

Each applicant that has submitted all required materials to SNIHR (*Coverletter, Resume, 3 Work Related References, Employment application*) will be contacted by the Immersion Director/Teacher to schedule the Admissions test.

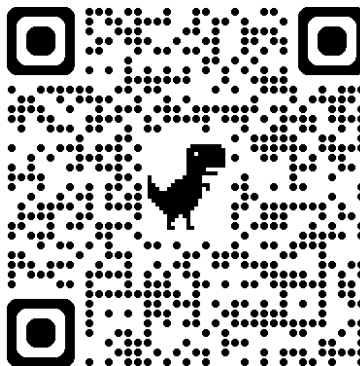
The Admissions test is a timed oral test and will contain 20 questions, translating 10 English to Seneca and 10 Seneca to English. There are 2 separate tests available and each applicant will have the opportunity to take each test, if desired. The higher score/test time of the 2 tests will be utilized in the selection process.

The testing process is used as a gauge to better evaluate potential candidates on the abilities of active memory recall, self-studying and initiative.

It is not pass/fail per say but we are looking for specific attributes that ensure student success. Say if the first time you test you get 8/20 and the next time you get 18/20 with a two day turn around. That shows us that the candidate embodies the attributes and models the abilities necessary for success in immersion.

Attributes being self-awareness, critical thinking, determination and self-discipline.
